Since 2018, AgeOptions has partnered with local public libraries (currently 37) in suburban Cook County to deliver educational and recreational programming. Our library program aims to address social isolation in communities by providing resources through technology and targeted programming to build community engagement.

Why partner with libraries? Libraries provide a unique way of reaching older adults as a nontraditional service starting point. Libraries are accessible to all; they strive to eliminate barriers to entry and provide a trusted source for education and recreational programming. Older adults who would not consider contacting their local senior services agency to learn about valuable and available services can now do so within the library's confines. As library partners learn more about external social service agencies through AgeOptions, they gain valuable resources to connect older adults with previously unfamiliar services. Finally, libraries provide opportunities for learning, socializing, participating, and reducing social isolation. The relationship-building between older adult patrons and their library cannot be overstated.
